You don't need to go to your GP.

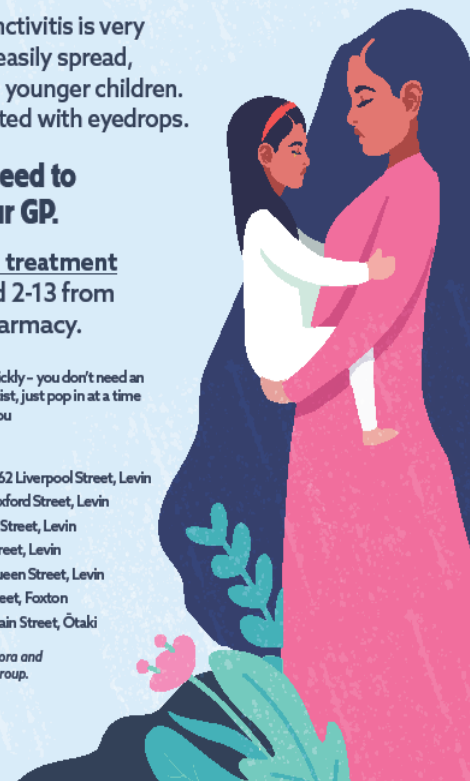
You can get **free treatment** for tamariki aged 2-13 from your local pharmacy.
