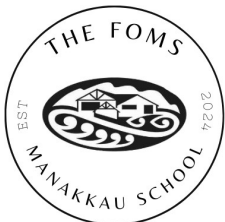

Seesaw App

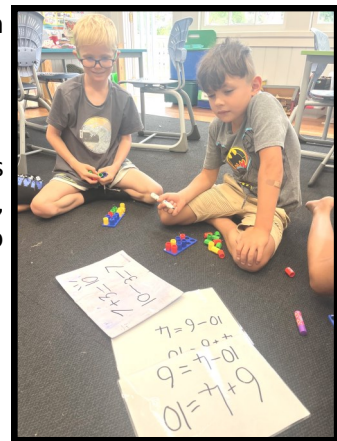
