"It is great to applaud the teams that placed. Congratulations to Hokowhitu A (1st), Parkland B (2nd), and Manakau (3rd) in the Year 5 & 6 competition and Fairfield (1st), Faith City B (2nd), and Faith City A (3rd) in the Year 7 & 8.

The Year 5 & 6 was a close fought competition with not many points between them. The winner got 55 out of 70 and 2nd and 3rd were close behind on 54 (with the tie-breaker deciding it). With some tricky rounds in the Year 7 & 8 competition things were a bit more spread out - I didn't know many of the answers! The winning team got 81 out of a 100 and the 2nd and 3rd were 81 (with a tie breaker deciding it) and 78 respectively."

News from the Board

Our recent board meeting with karakia led by the new presiding chair, Mel Baxter. We welcomed Mel into this role and our community can be assured that we, your board, have the best interests of our school at the forefront of our decisions. In our Governance role there are many areas we cover. We are the employer of all staff, and set the overall strategic direction for our school. At each meeting we cover many different areas, some of which include:

- Health and Safety
- Property
- Policy

Our principal Deb is the 'chief executive', her role is to manage the day to day operations of the school in line with the board's direction and policies. In her latest report to the board, Deb shared our latest (from Term 1) attendance data. Our overall attendance rate for term 1 of 75% and punctuality rate of 78% are an area we would like to see improved. It was interesting to note that holidays in term time are considered non attendance in our percentages. This is short of the Government's goals (85%) for attendance and is an area for us to work on. Deb will be making contact with families with attendance under 85% to see if there is any additional support you need.

We would also like to let you know that we will once again be seeing some infrastructure work at school. This week builders start work on the exterior walls of the staffroom. Included in this 12 week project will also be modernisation of Awhi Rito's class, plumbing work under the staffroom, replacing butanol roofing over the Kereru Block, and the establishment of the Learning Support Coordinators office space and a revamp of the staffroom. These are significant works and we are really pleased to have the 'go' from the Ministry of Education.

To enable Awhi Rito modernisation we have to move some classes. Awhi Rito (Mrs Shukers class) will move to the Huia Block, and Tumeke (Mrs Dears class) will move to Korimako.


Here are some ways we can all work together to improve:

Ag Day 2024

In preparation for Ag day this year...

If you are interested in caring for and training a lamb, kid or calf the dates to remember are as follows:

Birth dates for lambs and kids are 15th July onwards.

Birth dates for calves are 1st July to 31st August inclusive.

We encourage students to think about entering the Manakau School garden section of Ag Day. Manakau School does not follow the guidelines/rules set by the Horowhenua Boys and Girls Agricultural Club but we do encourage the children to plant and grow their own little piece of paradise whether it is in a pot, garden, tyre etc. These will be judged later on towards the end of November with the final date still to be confirmed.

Our Agricultural Day will be held on the week of November 11-15, 2024.

Group finals are at Levin on November 22, 2024. All calves and yearling must have a NAIT tag, but you do not need to notify their movement for Ag days.

Notice of Asbestos Removal Work

We are reminding our community that there is going to be removal of some asbestos at school during the July holidays. Commencing on 8 July 2024 and is expected to finish on 9 July 2024.

Manakau School management and board of trustees have been consulted about the nature and timing of this work, together with the safety measures to be used.

- We are recommending that you do not visit the school over these 2 days.
- Signs and temporary fencing/barriers will be installed.
- PVA solution or water will be applied to asbestos containing materials to prevent airborne asbestos fibres dust as required.
- Air monitoring at the work site boundary will be in place for the duration of the work.
- Asbestos containing material will be wrapped on site and disposed of at an approved site.
- An independent party will carry out an inspection of the site on completion of the work, and issue a clearance certificate.


